

Ahtanum View Correctional Complex

Location - Yakima, Washington (509) 573-6333
Superintendent: Terry Antles
Assisted Living, Minimum Custody Operating Capacity – 120
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$57,499

This facility includes a 60-bed work release and a 120-bed assisted living facility. The facility houses the aged, medically challenged and disabled offenders who are not able to program at larger correctional facilities. It focuses on offenders becoming independent and self-sufficient so they can be productive when transitioned to the community.

Airway Heights Corrections Center

Location - Airway Heights, Washington (509) 244-6700

Medium and Minimum Custody Operating Capacity – 2,136
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$23,701

This facility offers a wide range of work programs. There are currently over 1200 jobs available between the main facility and the Minimum Security Unit. They include Correctional Industries, Department of Natural Resources fire suppression and reforestation, and various institution jobs.

Cedar Creek Corrections Center

Location - Litterock, Washington (360) 753-7278

Minimum Custody Operating Capacity – 400
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$22,063

This facility is a work camp and therefore all offenders are required to work and/or program. Work opportunities include Correctional Industries, Department of Natural Resources fire suppression and reforestation, and community work crews.

Clallam Bay Corrections Center

Location - Clallam Bay, Washington (360) 963-2000

Maximum, Close, and Medium Custody Operating Capacity – 858
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$33,665

This facility houses a high number of offenders convicted of violent crimes. Work opportunities include the Correctional Industries garment factory as well as various institution jobs. Also available at this facility is education and chemical dependency programming.

Coyote Ridge Corrections Center

Minimum Custody Operating Capacity – 600
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$22,138

This facility is the location of one of the two minimum custody male residential therapeutic communities, which is a nine to twelve month chemical dependency program and is the most intensive form of primary treatment available with the Department. This facility is a work camp and therefore all offenders are required to work and/or program. Offenders at this facility have work opportunities with Correctional Industries as well as the Pheasant Farm, which is a collaborative effort with the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Larch Corrections Center

Minimum Custody Operating Capacity – 400
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$22,531

This facility is the location of one of the two minimum custody male residential therapeutic communities, which is a nine to twelve month chemical dependency program and is the most intensive form of primary treatment available at the Department. This facility is a work camp and therefore all offenders are required to work and/or program. Work opportunities include the Department of Natural Resources fire suppression and reforestation and community work crews.

McNeil Island Corrections Center

Location - Steilacoom, Washington (253) 588-5281

Maximum, Medium, and Minimum Custody Operating Capacity – 1,292
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$37,431

This facility is located 2.8 miles from Steilacoom, Washington in southern Puget Sound. Because of its location, McNeil Island Corrections Center operates its own fire department. Offenders participating on the fire crew are required to pass training similar to that of any fireman. Offenders also work on the marine fleet, which includes passenger ferries, tug boats, and barges.

Mission Creek Corrections Center for Women

Minimum Custody Operating Capacity – 200
Cost Per Offender Per Year – \$34,925

This facility once served as a juvenile facility for the State of Washington. The Department recently opened it to address the shortfall of female capacity in the system. The Department is planning on increasing the capacity in the coming years.

Monroe Correctional Complex

Location - Monroe, Washington (360) 794-2600

Close, Medium, and Minimum Custody Operating Capacity – 2,446
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$39,772

This facility is the site of the Sex Offender Treatment Program. Any adult male sex offender in a DOC prison may volunteer for the program, which treats 200 offenders at a time. Offenders enter treatment when they are within 18 months of release and are expected to continue receiving treatment in the community for up to three years after release. This facility is also the site of the Special Offender Unit, which provides evaluation, diagnosis, and treatment for mentally ill, seriously mentally ill, and dangerous mentally ill offenders within the Department.

Olympic Corrections Center

Location - Forks, Washington (360) 374-6181

Minimum Custody Operating Capacity – 340
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$23,102

This facility is a work camp and therefore all offenders are required to work and/or program. Work opportunities include Department of Natural Resources fire suppression and reforestation and community work crews.

Pine Lodge Corrections Center for Women

Location - Medical Lake, Washington (509) 299-2300

Minimum Custody Operating Capacity – 359
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$29,172

The facility was converted to all females in Fiscal Year 2005. This facility is the location of the female residential therapeutic community, which is a nine to twelve month chemical dependency program and is the most intensive form of primary treatment available at the Department.

Stafford Creek Corrections Center

Location - Aberdeen, Washington (360) 537-1800
Acting Superintendent: Pat Glebe
Maximum and Medium Custody Operating Capacity – 1,936
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$24,119

This facility has recently implemented the first residential therapeutic community for medium custody offenders, which is a nine to twelve month chemical dependency program and is the most intensive form of primary treatment available with the Department. Work opportunities include Correctional Industries and maintenance of the physical plant.

Washington Corrections Center

Location - Shelton, Washington (360) 426-4433
Superintendent: Doug Waddington
Maximum, Close, and Medium Custody Operating Capacity – 1,298
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$27,573

All adult male felons who are sent to prison are initially tested and classified at the Reception Center, except for those male offenders sentenced to death. Male offenders sentenced to death are transferred directly to the Washington State Penitentiary from the sentencing court. Once testing and classification are complete offenders are transferred to their parent facility.

Washington Corrections Center for Women

Location - Gig Harbor, Washington (253) 858-4200
Superintendent: Douglas Cole
Close, Medium, and Minimum Custody Operating Capacity – 738
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$42,179

This facility processes all female offenders placed under the Department's custody. Offenders remain at the Reception Center until a custody level can be determined. This facility's minimum unit currently houses the Residential Parenting Program, which allows selected female offenders who give birth while incarcerated to return to the institution with their infants for a designated period of time. This facility also is the location of the Prison Pet Partnership, which teaches the offender marketable job skills in the pet care industry.

Washington State Penitentiary

Location - Walla Walla, Washington (509) 525-3610
Superintendent: Steve Sinclair
Maximum, Close, Medium, and Minimum Operating Capacity – 1,988
Cost Per Offender Per Year - \$37,301

Opening for operation on May 10, 1887 as a territorial prison, the penitentiary is the historical starting point for Washington State Corrections. This facility houses long-term and violent offenders. It also houses the state's death row offenders and, when judicially mandated, conducts the executions. Work opportunities include Correctional Industries, including producing the license plates for the state of Washington.

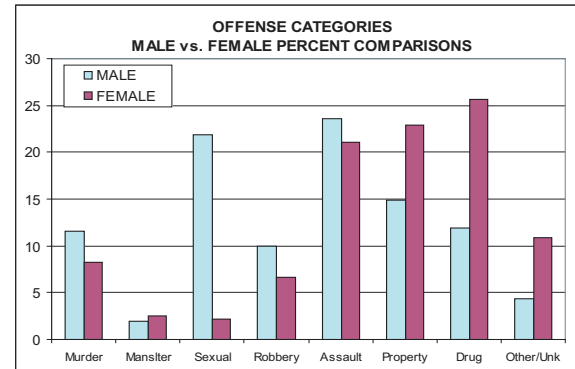

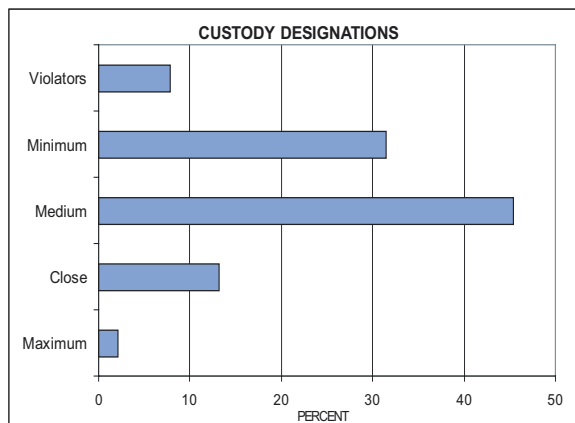

Substance Abuse Treatment Programs, State certified treatment for offenders who are chemically dependent.

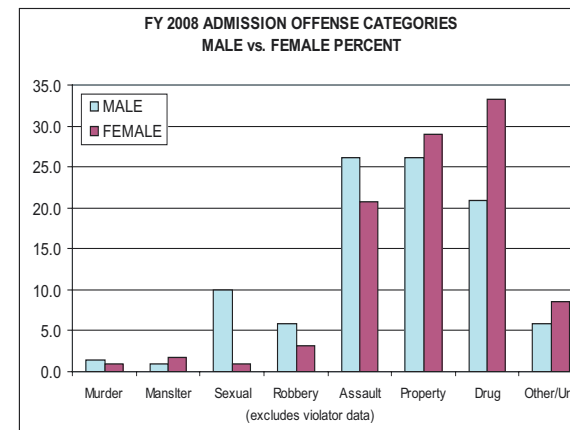
