ASSOCIATE LANGUAGE INTERPRETING

The Pierce College Language Interpreting Program is both an I-BEST program and an Opportunity Grant pathway, providing both greater access and academic support to students. Interpreters serve as a linguistic and cultural bridge between non-English-speaking immigrants and the agencies that provide them with services. In Pierce County, these agencies rely on interpreters to make communication and understanding possible to their clients. The Department of Social and Health Services tests and certifies or registers (depending on the language) interpreters for social service and medical needs. The Administrative Office of the Courts tests and certifies or registers interpreters for the state court system. The federal court system also has an interpreter program. Certified interpreters that have successfully learned the skills can earn \$22/hour and up.

The Pierce College Associate Degree in Language Interpreting program prepares students to work as interpreters in the social service, medical, and legal fields. In the course of the program, successful students obtain at least a Washington State Level I social service interpreter certification. Students participate in a practicum and other professional development activities that lead toward additional certification in their area(s) of interest.
